

A Few Minutes With... MATT MOY

Round and round we go, and where do we stop? Oh, we know... on one of the most heartwarming returns to the fold we've ever had in our continuing lecture series, Inside The Voice Actor's Studio. Our guest is none other than Voicetrax Alum Matt Moy, whose credits include animated series Steven Universe, on-camera series regular on the hit television show 2 Broke Girls and his current, recurring role on American Auto. As is our tradition with this little featurette of ours, we dip our toe in the Matt Moy pool, ahead of our big interview on Saturday, September 16th, to give you a sneak peek into the fun and fruitful learning to be had chatting away with Matt...

Voicetrax: Did you dream of a creative career when you were a boy?

Matt Moy: No, not at all. When I was a young boy, I didn't know what I wanted to do. When I was in high school, I did theatre with my friends, but that was just to hang out with my friends. It wasn't to become an actor. I was still too shy. When I was in college, I majored in Japanese and Linguistics because that was what I was good at. Acting or anything creative wasn't a tangible career for me. It's a weird thing

when you go into arts. You think, it almost seems like a dream. But it's not. It's the same as any other job once you possess the skills necessary.

VT: So how did you make your way to voice-over?

MM: By the time I graduated college I had kind of fallen out of love with my Japanese major. Can you imagine spending all that time and money and then telling your mom I don't really want to do that anymore? Luckily

for me both of my parents were very supportive, and my mom suggested, "Well you enjoyed yourself when you were acting in high school with your friends and you were pretty successful at it. Why don't you try voice-over"?

VT: Why voice-over and not theatre or on-camera?

MM: Because it was behind the scenes. I didn't really like the notion of being in front of a camera. Still too shy.

MM: Yeah...

VT: And how lucky were you that your parents were so supportive of a creative career path!

MM: Actually, I hadn't told them I wanted to be an actor. At the time, I didn't even know for myself that I wanted to be an actor. They just knew I had a hard time keeping a job because I would very quickly get bored and quit. I ended up jumping from job to job to job. They were just searching for something – anything – that I might actually stick to. My mom found the Finding Your Voice intro class with Samantha. I decided to try it



out and see if I liked it. And in that first class, I fell in love with voice-over. I started taking class after class and I was talking about what I was learning to my parents every single night. They just knew I was going to stick with it.

VT: So, you found your passion?


MM: Weeellll, yes, I suppose, but equally important I found something I liked that I could also build a career at. This probably isn't very "actor-y" to say, but when I hear people who tell me they want to be an actor and it's going to be a "journey", I think whoa, pump the brakes. What my ears hear when they say that is: they're going to dabble a little over there and a little over here and take a semester to view the sunset over the mountain ridge. I'm like, no. If you want to build a career at voice-over, you need to roll up your sleeves and work, just like anything else you want to achieve. You can have the dream, but dreams need to be accompanied by actions. A dream without action is just a dream. =

VT: We're all about action around here!

MM: (laughing) Don't I know it!

VT: You've already had an amazing run with your on-camera career so far, being

a series regular for six seasons on 2 Broke Girls. (Ed. note: Go watch it. It's hilarious.) What commonalities do on-camera and voice-over have?



Broke Girls. With the brilliant actors I was working with live on set, I had to be on my toes, stay ready for anything, listen to my partner and perform on cue. Those are all skills I use in voice-over.

VT: We're really looking forward to your animation lab that's happening after the big interview. There will be 12 lucky students who get to be in your class. What should they prepare for?

MM: (laughing) Anything and everything. Improving live on in-class animation scripts, coming up with a second and third characters on the fly and recording something at home for us to dissect in class. We are going to pack a LOT into those three hours!

acting career. So much to learn on so many levels! Plus, as previously mentioned, Matt will be teaching an afternoon animation lab The Moy Wonder (p. 30) later the same Saturday from 2:00-5:00pm PST.

But first, a bit of history about our founder...

Samantha Paris is a multiple award-winning voice actor, acclaimed educator, entrepreneur and author of "Finding The Bunny: The secrets of America's most influential and invisible art revealed through the struggles of one woman's journey" (Voice Haven Productions, 2018). Her memoir was optioned in 2019 by Warner Brothers for development into a television series. Since establishing Voicetrax in 1988, Samantha has trained more than 15,000 aspiring and working voice actors in the San Francisco Bay Area and Southern California and now from all over the world, thanks to video conferencing technology. Not surprisingly, students from all over the country flock to Voicetrax based on its reputation for first-class training. And thanks to conferencing technology, Samantha can also bring her expertise to anyone interested in voice-over, no matter their geography. This all culminates in Samantha's greatest passion: helping others find their true voices and realize their dreams through voice acting.

Samantha's own single-minded dream of becoming an actress began as a little girl growing up in Southern California, under her given name Bobbi Block. She began performing at the age of five and took her first voice-over class at age fifteen. One year later, she landed an agent and thrillingly so, saw her fervent dreams take flight. Over the next twelve years, Samantha enjoyed a career that included over 1,000 national and regional commercials, roles in nearly 200 half-hour animated television cartoon shows, including the mega-hit cult series Jem and the Holograms. She landed appearances in episodic television and a starring role in the ABC After School Special I Think I'm Having A Baby. She also had the distinct honor of starring with Michael Landon in a two-episode storyline on Highway To Heaven.

But with all of her career success, including three Clio Awards, there was a voice inside Samantha telling her there had to be something more, though she couldn't put her finger on exactly what that something more was. The only thing she knew for sure was that she had one major dream still unanswered: to live near the Golden Gate Bridge. Going purely on instinct and with no specific plan in place, she moved to the Bay Area in 1988 and bought a home in Mill Valley. Shortly thereafter, Samantha was unwittingly thrust into the teaching profession, giving voice-over lessons to budding voice actors – first one, then two, and then before she knew it, there were 30, then 40 students!

And so, Voicetrax San Francisco was formed one year later. The media world quickly caught on to what Samantha was doing and featured her widely in media outlets throughout Northern California, including all major newspapers, the hugely popular Ronn Owens radio show (several appearances) and local television programs. In what seemed like a blink of an eye, students were multiplying and quite unexpectedly to her, Samantha had unconsciously created a groundbreaking training program and a flourishing business. By the time the San Francisco Chronicle deemed her "the most successful voice-over coach in the Bay Area", the Voicetrax San Francisco studio, built in 1992, was located in Sausalito, just minutes away from her beloved Golden Gate Bridge.

Beginning in 2002, Samantha successfully ran Voicetrax Desert Cities in Rancho Mirage, California, where she trained aspiring and working voice actors. For personal reasons – and with enormous difficulty given her love for and dedication to her desert-based students – she eventually decided to close the school in 2005, thus ending her monthly commute between the Bay Area and the Coachella Valley. However, in 2020 the pandemic caused her to return to the desert full-time to shelter-in-place, which gave Samantha a second opportunity to bring voice acting training back to the Greater Palm Springs area in full force. She has since resumed working with former students and new ones, which is even more accessible now thanks to video conferencing and technological advances in the voice-over field in general.

Now, 35 years later, Voicetrax stands out as the largest, most comprehensive and respected voice-over academy in the United States. With a rotating curriculum of nearly 100 different courses of study, Samantha and her distinguished team of guest directors help each student accomplish their unique goals.

Voicetrax students come from all walks of life, backgrounds and interests, many of whom have gone on to book voice-over jobs regularly to supplement their incomes, and many others who go on to make voice-over their full-time (and handsome) living. In addition to the outstanding training that students get at Voicetrax, they also experience an extraordinary sense of community, camaraderie and support in this unique haven for voice actors.

With a fierce commitment to the philosophy that "talent can be taught", Samantha built her hugely successful business strictly through enthusiastic word of mouth, substantial media attention and satisfied, longstanding voice acting students. Above all through Voicetrax, Samantha has helped transform the lives of thousands by way of her one-of-a-kind approach to teaching and coaching. And as a result of this gratifying process, Samantha has ultimately realized her own deepest dreams and the ultimate satisfaction as an artist.

Frank Coppola

So how many times do you hear something like this: an actor, freshly minted as a Big Apple performer, Fiddler On The Roof his first Broadway show, understudy for 13 roles because what are the odds, right? actors. And dancers. AND singers. With great power comes great responsibility... not that we're trying to dazzle you with words of wisdom, it's just something **DAN GILVEZAN** heard a lot on one of this first jobs in LA (*Spider-Man & His Amazing Friends* on NBC)! Dan really does go that far back, from *Spider-Man* through a memorable on-camera Jack In The Box campaign and episodic TV to video game titles like *Transformers: Devastation*, dancing and weaving all the while with this jealous mistress known as Show Business. But while she can be cruel, Show Business can also be seduced with a combination of talent, training, stick-to-itiveness and a pinch of luck – and Dan has wooed her for over forty years with that winning combination. As a voice-over pro, TV guest star, stage actor, screen personality and author, Dan has bucked the odds and carved out a place for himself in a challenging profession, all the while gaining a wealth of knowledge of the inner workings of the business of voice-over show. And lucky for us, he's more than willing to share the secrets of that winning combination with you here at Voicetrax!

Melissa Gray

It's actually something that sounds better when you scream it: "VOLUME IS NOT AN ACTING CHOICE!" - certainly a bedrock principle for all those tender, sensitive microphones you'll encounter as a voice actor. But oddly enough, MELISSA GRAY wasn't even thinking strictly as a voice actor when she came up with that mantra. Melissa is a theater purist, you see, and although she'd studied with Stella Adler and Terry Schreiber, and then ignited a great career on stage, she had no idea what a voice-over even WAS until casting agents from a New York advertising agency wound up in the audience one night for a showing of Burn This! A one-week voice-over intensive program left Melissa with this piece of brusque wisdom: "you've got money written all over your voice but you don't know squat what to do with it!" So Melissa just resorted to what came naturally: she relied purely on her acting skills to translate and enliven commercial copy, booked a three-year campaign for Hanes Her Way panties right out of the gate and never looked back - and if that doesn't prove voice-over is all about acting, acting, acting, what does? Melissa's since developed an entire series of study for undergrads and MFA students in Acting and Creative Writing at the Academy of Art University in San Francisco, and she brings a specially tailored program to Voicetrax!



Now who manages to feel like a misfit for having a big, deep voice? It was the first question **CHUCK KOUROUKLIS** asked Voicetrax Founder Samantha Paris when he began as a Voicetrax

student 19 years ago: is there a place in voice-over for people with deep voices anymore? It sure didn't seem to be what we were hearing on radio ads at the time. Years of stage acting, years of broadcasting – some as the overnight lead-in to Jimmy Kimmel's morning radio show – and yes, that big, beautiful voice. Chuck has managed to NOT rest on the laurels of his natural talents because he understands that voice-over is all about acting and not about your voice, no matter how distinctive it is. Chuck has mastered navigating the ever-changing demands of voice-over from big announcer types to the throaty "Darius" in League of Legends to the adenoidal "Mr. Toad" in Telltale's The Wolf Among Us, to the light-sounding guy next door for the multitude of commercials he's done, and most recently a Netflix cartoon series he's not allowed to talk about yet. Then like a master puppeteer wielding control of his voice-over strings, he sprinkles back in a little bit of that natural born gravitas for all types of narration, especially medical. This Jack-of-all voice-over trades is a stalwart professor for all Voicetrax students, as his booming voice belies his patient and nurturing teaching style.

Sirenetta Leoni

To this day, Dennis Haysbert – President Palmer in the TV series 24 and the current Allstate Insurance spokesman – is an imposing man, can we all agree? Now wind the clock back to imagine him in a

college scene study class, early 20s with a 6-inch Afro, clutching a monologue from Neil Simon's "Plaza Suite" for a middle-aged Jewish business owner in New York City! Dennis himself wasn't sure anybody would buy it till his classmate and director for this scene, SIRENETTA LEONI, told him, "relax, you're in good hands" – and then proceeded to shape his performance beyond ANY question. And the rest, as they say, is history! Sirenetta is no stranger to pressure, which is why a giant tech firm can throw her and a voice actor into a break room with an excavator breaking boulder-sized concrete chunks right outside the window and STILL come out with a pristine recorded performance! She's acted on major interactive projects like Telltales' Tales Of Monkey Island and EA Games' The Godfather, she's directed the voice of Google Assistant and Google Home, and she's forgotten more about audio tours, educational game VO, and directional prompts than many of us will ever know! And, she's our narration demo guru to boot! Sirenetta started her acting career at Voicetrax and teaches with us to this day.

Ned Lott

You wander in a ring like Jane Eyre caught in some grave peccadillo, except there's a mic in there capturing you performing crowd noise for a film... you're watching some strange track of a movie

with countdown beeps, and on the third, you'd better be ready to jump in with your line... or maybe, you're just flat-out SINGING – and not merely as yourself, but as a

We couldn't be more pleased to have this original Groundling with us.

Aaron Miner

Behold Voicetrax's own Blackbelt in Karate! He also dabbles in Jiujitsu. What does this tell you about **AARON MINER**, aside from the fact that it's probably not the best idea to piss him off? There's

nothing quite like martial arts to instill focus, discipline, dedication and confidence in the practitioner – all of which have become immensely helpful habits for Aaron, who's certainly put his time in and paid his dues as he studied at Voicetrax. Even when it looked like there was no end in sight, he NEVER LET UP in pursuit of his goal and dream. As with martial arts, Aaron came to understand the struggle in voice acting – getting back on your feet after failure, using defeat to make yourself stronger and better and lay a strong foundation for the ultimate success he now enjoys! some stock, it was time for a career reboot: "Hi, my name is Tasia Valenza and I'd like you to represent me doing voiceovers. I'm an Emmy nominated Actress... I have a great voice and it seems easy." To Tasia's great fortune, that agent gave her a business card – not for another agent, but for a voice-over coach, and she learned that yes, voice over was indeed a skill and craft very different from on camera, theatre or any other form of acting... and she loved it! After six years of doing both on camera and voiceover, it became clear Tasia's heart (and voice!) belonged just to voiceover. Tasia's since cut across nearly any genre you can name – commercials, promos, trailers, narration, radio imaging – recently winning a Telly Award and an Emmy! And she loves teaching such a wonderful craft at Voicetrax too.

It's a great feeling to audition well, listen back and be satisfied. Even though I'm pretty sure that a year from now I'll listen again and think, I know I can do that better. ~John Eleby



With a million-dollar voice, Dave could have rested on his laurels, but he's studied hard to develop his acting chops and he'll absolutely do the same for you. Spend the weekend with Dave as he shares his philosophies examining how authenticity and context always bring a starring and even a bit player video game performance to life.

IT REMAINS TO BE SCENE



Director: Jeannie Elias **Length:** 10-hour weekend seminar

Class Notes: This course includes a pre-class homework assignment. This course has a one month drop deadline.

It does your acting good to take a break, every once in a while, from voice-over scripts, lest you think the whole world speaks in nothing but thirty and sixty second clips. And Jeannie wanted us to tell you that "there will in no way, shape or form be ANYTHING voice-over" in her world premiere, jam-packed, scene study seminar. She will however be partnering you with a dialogue partner and providing you a scene from a film or play (don't fret there is no memorizing required... whew!). You will explore, analyze and disappear into your scene throughout the weekend. And because we know that voice-over <u>is</u> acting for the microphone, any time spent strengthening your acting skills in a different medium will inevitably make you a better voice actor.

OFF THE PAGE

Director: Tasia Valenza Length: 10-hour weekend seminar Class Notes: None

As you start to really amp up your performances to a working professional, real-world, competitive level, one of the hardest things to do is to take words that you didn't write and might not ever say, at least not in the way they've written it (have you EVER said introducing while sharing an exciting secret with a best friend?!?), and make them feel genuine, alive and real, aka "getting the words off the page". Professionally performing since childhood both in front of the camera and behind the microphone, Tasia will employ her tricks of the trade, literally born from a lifetime of breaking down scripts of all flavors, to assist you in digging deep to flush out the true meaning of the script while developing the skills necessary to get unnatural voice-over copy to sound off-the-cuff and true. Approach commercial scripts as "mini plays" from a true actor's perspective to get the most of out the script and your performance.

ONE NIGHT WONDER: GIBBERISH













Director: Aaron Miner Length: 3-hour lab Class Notes: None

We know gibberish (giving voice to a character without any English words) is intimidating. We totally get it. So, we've taken it upon ourselves to offer you this very lucrative voice-over sector in an easily consumable, non-threatening portion: A One Night Wonder three-hour lab! Experience the freeing, imaginative FUN that comes with gibberish. Using improv games amongst other things, our resident gibberish expert Aaron, will break down this skill set into manageable parts, and build it and you back up again. Before you know it, you will be speaking a language straight from your imagination. And we're betting that like everyone else who took the jump into gibberish before you, that although you might be a bit afraid at first, you will end up calling the office afterwards saying, "OMG why didn't I take this class sooner? It was so much fun and one of the best classes I've ever had!" Yeppers. We hear that a LOT.

I was told constantly by my family that I was shy, always clinging to my mother's skirts. When I took Vicki's Know Your Zero class, I immediately listed shy as one of my personality traits. Vicki questioned this, so I started investigating the word and discovered that I wasn't really shy, but reserved and quiet; liking to be in the background but still telling people what to do and being in charge. My experience in this class made me realize that I can be strong in who I am, and that I have my own unique voice. Voicetrax has given me new confidence in myself. Whether they're looking for someone who sounds like the hot "celebrity du jour" or a veteran voice actor who is highly regarded within the industry but not a household name, this seminar will give you a chance to immerse yourself in a wide variety of styles while listening, duplicating, and broadening your own vocal range by "borrowing" from the most sought-after spokespeople and character actors. By mimicking another actor's syncopation, tone or attitude it will not only widen your interpretation possibilities, but it can open the door, inspire creativity and be the foundation of a whole new character for you to develop. This is a "must have" skill for any working voice actor.

We stopped short of calling this Vicki vs. Aaron (who would you bet on?), but it's true that each week the roster will be divided between two teams who will duke it out for serious bragging rights. But don't get too cozy on the team you're on initially because each week the teams will be rearranged based on a very specific genre and style including commercial girl/guy next door, accented video game and cartoon characters, villains and villainesses, wise storytellers and authoritative but approachable narrators. This class hits on self-direction, script analysis, script choice, performing without much time for preparation, and includes a wide variety of genres and roles that are asked for often in auditioning. Super relevant and taught by two working voice actors. And if this jam-packed workshop isn't enough, at the end of the four weeks, both Agron and Vicki will each pick an overall "winner" and whomever they pick will win a free private lesson from them. C'mon, we needed to have some kind of contest, it is called Teaming With Talent.

Director: Thom Pinto Length: 10-hour weekend seminar Class Notes: None

One of the ironies of our business is that frequently, the short copy bears the most income. In this class, Thom divulges his techniques that are right at your fingertips to ensure that your three in a row aren't just slow, medium and fast takes of the exact same read and are truly unique and commercially viable, whether it's announcer tags, character one-liners or :15 spots. If producers are listening to hundreds of one-liners, it's critical that you grab their attention from the get-go, no time to warm into your performance. And no matter what kind of copy you audition (short or long form), when you book a session, you'll often be asked to perform a particular line three times in a row, and by "often" we mean in every single voice-over session you will EVER be in. So yeah, there's that.



Take a moment to get into an extra comfortable position, preferably lying down if that's possible, as you take in the information of this world premiere class description. That's right... breath in... and out...wonderful. The meditation app industry is set to hit a billion dollars revenue in 2023. Keep that breathing slow and steady, but yes, we did say billion with a B. That kind of snuck up on all of us, didn't it? We have manifested the unlikeliest of instructors to take you on this "guided" tour (see what we did there?) of what it takes to be a competitive meditation narrator. Erik Braa, more famously known for his burly, Viking-like characters in a zillion video games, just happens to have the delicate touch for meditation. He'll let you in on the techniques necessary for this burgeoning slice of the voice-over pie. And hey, at the end of the day, who else will be able to say they've been taught how to narrate a meditation app by a Viking?

TOURS, TUTORIALS & TALES: THE STORY WITHIN

BACK BY POPULAR DEVAND

This workshop is prepared to take your narration skills up a notch or two while still telling a great story. And since narration is one of the dominant genres in the voice-over industry with opportunities multiplying year after year, this class is a perfect vehicle to transform you into a narrator to be reckoned with. By further honing your visualization techniques, script analysis, self-direction and acting choices, you'll learn to deliver the more authentic and conversational reads that are in demand. You'll span several genres including audio tour, industrial tech, tutorial and medical narration that are so prevalent in today's narration market.

Our troubles emerged when we were trying to decide which genre we should develop for class: characters or narration, narration or characters? Finally, a member of the legen-wait for it-dary Voicetrax Think Tank said, "ummm... why don't we just do both?" Brilliant! Format refresher: During these two separate information-packed (and when we say packed, we mean stuffed to the rafters and beyond) workshops you'll develop a clear understanding of the demo production process from start to finish including copy selection, recording, editing and post-production. You'll discover what your strengths are and how to highlight them in a way that will grab the attention of agents and producers, as well as common mistakes to avoid. By the last week of class, students will have produced, performed, self-directed and packaged their own mock demo.

After all is said and done and the frivolity has run its course, Janet will have put a jolt in your character performances that will take your interpretation off the page and book the job, all while having one hell of a time.

DIRECT THYSELF: THE ULTIMATE UNDERTAKING

Length: 21-hour six-week workshop (Three Friday afternoons followed by three Thursday nights)

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Class Notes: This course includes a pre-class homework assignment. Students must have home recording capabilities.

All other Direct Thyself classes have led to this, the definitive challenge in the Direct Thyself saga. (dun, dun, duuuunnnn....) This six-week course will be taught by you, the students. Not quite a Lord of The Flies mutiny, but each week students will decide the curriculum for the entire class, whether it's an audition exercise with the same copy for everyone or specific copy suited to each individual. Not only will you select copy, but you will be responsible for bringing your fellow students to a competitive read through your clear and succinct direction. Each class will end with Samantha not only critiquing the in-class performances, but she will also break down your acumen as a director. Samantha has always said that teaching and directing other actors drove her skills as a performer to a level she would have never reached by acting alone. Here's your chance to have that scary yet exhibitanting experience for "thyself".



Ah yes, the infamous bunny, hopping around with his mischievous smile, wreaking havoc and trampling all over your script analysis confidence. How many times have you found yourself in class or auditioning at home, screaming to yourself, "Where is that f#cking bunny?!?" Well here's an interesting fact for you to ponder: sometimes in scripts there isn't a bunny at all. Wait... what?!? Auuugh! To help you traverse this panorama is none other than the originator of the whole bunny concept herself, Miss Samantha Paris. C'mon, who else was going to teach a class called Finding The Bunny, for reals? Utilizing scripts from Sam and some you pick yourself, the class will include really digging deep into scripts, staring at them to figure out if there truly is a bunny there or not and then performing or directing them. Basically, it's a Sam class so be ready for anything. Lest you forget finding the bunny in a script will put you ahead of 99% of the rest of the actors you're competing against, giving you an amazing advantage to book the gig!

F#@K THE SPECS

Directors: Samantha Paris, **Length:** 12-hour four-week workshop Brian Sommer

Class Notes: This course includes homework assignments. Students must have home recording capabilities.

The specs on a piece of voice-over copy have long stirred epic debates on how much or how little to pay attention to them. Are the specs a barren wasteland that say, "friendly and conversational"? On the other end of the spectrum, are the specs verbose (longer than the actual script even) and conflicting, making it easy to get caught up in them, getting in the way of a truly connected (translation: bookable) performance? So, what do you do? Every time you look at a new script the FIRST THING you should be asking yourself BEFORE you look at the specs is "what are the words in the script telling me?" In this workshop, you'll get the answer to that all-important question. Samantha and Brian will take you through various spec-centric exercises with commercial and characters scripts respectively including reading the script without benefit of the specs to see if you naturally SEE the specs in the script. Find out what happens if you let the words on the page tell you what to do instead of relying on the specs. Take your script analysis skills to the highest level by making strong acting choices that result in a SPEC-tacular performance. See what we did there?

HOW'D | BOOK THAT?

Class Notes: The course includes a pre-class and weekly homework assignment. Students must have home recording capabilities.




